Our definition largely follows the one suggested by MFA, i.e., :

1) people provided with tangible goods/materials, such as resources, hygiene kits and food;

2) people provided with services, such as protection, healthcare, education or psycho-social support;

3) people supported through activities designed to raise knowledge, awareness and skills, such as training or mentoring.

Further, SOS counts:

4) only new people enrolled into a project in a given year. We are aware that this means that the numbers reached in year 2023, does not include people reached from previous years' entries, even if the same person continues to be supported.

5) for basket-funding, we only include the share of people reached, which is similar to the financial contribution of the part of the grant reported on.
